



OHFA Provincial Awards - 2024


Each year, OHFA and their Provincial Partners present several awards at each Regional Fair in Ontario. Students value these awards and proudly accept them at Regional Fair ceremonies.


All students, regardless of their abilities, are encouraged to participate in the Fairs program. Judges are encouraged to apply the award criteria with flexibility, taking into consideration the differentiation among our young learners.

General Criteria for all Awards:

- **Projects need to be related to the history, heritage or culture of Ontario or Canada, or both; and should:**
 - show evidence of good research and inquiry techniques: i.e. exploring topics, asking questions, accessing multiple primary and secondary sources in a variety of formats such as print, visual, digital, field trips, interviews with experts, collecting data and taking organized notes, synthesizing information, and reporting results
 - adhere to Canadian Copyright Law
 - demonstrate the ethical use of information

- **Students should:**
 - demonstrate knowledge and understanding of their project
 - demonstrate historical and critical thinking about their topic
 - demonstrate their research findings
 - show enthusiasm for their work through various methods of communication, i.e. verbal, documentary narrative, presentation boards, digital presentations
